1.	Breast self-examination (BSE)	a. This is an invasive colorectal cancer test should be done every 5 years, starting at age 50
2.	Digital Rectal Exam (DRE) & prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test	b. Women in their 20s and 30s, this type of breast exam is recommended this be part of a periodic health exam, preferably every 3 years. Women 40 and older should have this done with an annual physical
3.	Colonoscopy	c. This determines the size of the tumor and the existence of local invasions and distant metastasis. Tumor, nodes, and metastasis (TNM) system is frequently used.
4.	Fecal occult blood test (FOBT) or fecal immunochemical test (FIT)	d. This test should be administered to young men (who are usually embarrassed and won't tell)
5.	Mammography	e. Beginning in their early 20s, women should be told about this type of breast exam; the importance of prompt reporting of any new breast symptoms to a health professional emphasized; receive instruction and have technique reviewed; acceptable to choose not to do this or do it at irregular time intervals
6.	tumor staging	f. This is an invasive colorectal cancer test that should be done every 10 years, starting at age 50
7.	Clinical breast examination (CBE)	g. men and women should have this done annually starting at the age of 50, to test for colorectal cancer
8.	Testicular cancer test	h. These tests should be offered annually to men, starting at age 50 or for men who have a life expectancy of at least 10 years to check for prostate cancer.
9.	Flexible sigmoidoscopy	i. refers to the classification of tumor cells. This system seeks to define the type of tissue from which the tumor originated & the degree to which the tumor cells retain the functional and histologic characteristics of the tissue of origin (differentiation).
10.	Tumor grading	j. Women should begin this type of breast exam at age 40 and have it done annually (debatable).
11.	Contrast barium enema (DCBE)	k. Colorectal cancer test. This type of enema should be done every 5 years, starting at age 50

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
